Daily Itinerary

Sun, Feb 21

Depart the USA for Jerusalem.

Mon, Feb 22

Arrive in Tel Aviv and meet our tour guide and bus driver, who will accompany us for the next 10 days. If time permits, we will tour Jaffa before heading to Netanya for our first night in Israel. Overnight: David's Harp Hotel, Netanya (D)

Tues, Feb 23

Caesarea by the Sea / Mt. Carmel / Megiddo / Nazareth

After breakfast, we will visit Caesarea by the Sea, an incredible fortress built by King Herod the Great on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea. Here, Pontius Pilate had his base, Cornelius lived and was baptized, Paul embarked for Tarsus, and Philip preached. We then travel north to Mt. Carmel, where the prophet Elijah confronted the 400 false prophets of Baal. We continue inland to Megiddo, one of King Solomon's fortified cities, with ruins representing 26 levels of civilization. From here, the Books of Daniel and Revelation come alive as we read about the final Battle of Armageddon while overlooking the Jezreel Valley. We then continue to Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus. Overnight: Magdala Hotel (B)(L)(D)

Wed, Feb 24

Mt. of Beatitudes / Capernaum / Tabgha / Sea of Galilee / Jesus Boat Museum / Magdala

Today begins at the Mount of Beatitudes with a powerful time of worship where Jesus delivered His most famous message, The Sermon on the Mount. From there, we drive to Tabgha, the site of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. We continue to Capernaum, the center of Jesus' Galilean ministry and the site of many of His miracles, where we will see the remains of Peter's house and the synagogue where Jesus taught and worshipped. After enjoying a delicious St. Peter's fish lunch, we will experience an inspiring time of praise and worship aboard a wooden boat on the Sea of Galilee, followed by a visit to the Jesus Boat Museum to see a 2,000-year-old fishing boat discovered in 1986. The day concludes with a visit to Magdala, the hometown of Mary Magdalene, where we will see the ruins of a first-century synagogue where Jesus taught. Overnight: Magdala Hotel (B)(L)(D)

Thurs, Feb 25

Caesarea Philippi / Tel Dan / Golan Heights / Baptism in the Jordan River

Today we drive north to Tel Dan to see a 5,000-year-old gate that Abraham walked through on his way to rescue his nephew, Lot. We continue to Caesarea Philippi where Peter made his famous declaration: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." As we travel through the Golan Heights, we will stop at Mt. Bental to view the Syrian border. We conclude the day by celebrating our faith in Jesus Christ with baptisms in the Jordan River. Overnight: Magdala Hotel (B)(L)(D)

Friday, Feb 26

Beit She'an / Mt. Nebo / Petra

Today begins with a walk through Beit She'an, one of the most extensive archaeological sites in Israel and home to some of the best-preserved ruins in the Middle East. This is also the place where the bodies of King Saul and his sons were fastened to the city wall by the Philistines. We will cross the border into Jordan and ascend Mt. Nebo, where God showed Moses the Promised Land. Overnight: Mövenpick Hotel, Petra (B)(L)(D)

Sat, Feb 27

Petra / Eilat

After breakfast, we will tour Petra, one of the New Seven Wonders of the World, and marvel at the ancient city. We will see magnificent tombs, temples, and monuments carved directly into the rose-red rock and enjoy an opportunity to ride camels or horses. After lunch, we continue through the Jordanian wilderness to Eilat, a beautiful resort city on the shores of the Red Sea at Israel's southernmost point. Overnight: Dan Neptune Hotel, Eilat (B)(L)(D)

Sun, Feb 28

Timna Park / Tabernacle Replica / Dead Sea

After breakfast, we drive north along the probable route of the Israelites during the Exodus and stop at Timna Park to visit the fascinating replica of the biblical Tabernacle. Built after extensive research, this full-scale replica accurately reflects the appearance and dimensions described in Scripture. We conclude the day with the unforgettable experience of floating in the mineral rich waters of the Dead Sea and enjoy an afternoon of free time. Overnight: Herod's Dead Sea Hotel (B)(D)

Mon, March 1

Ein Gedi / Qumran / Old Jericho Road / Bethlehem

This morning begins at Ein Gedi, where David hid from King Saul and his 3,000 men. We then pass by the Qumran Caves, where a young shepherd discovered the Dead Sea Scrolls -

the oldest known biblical manuscripts in 1947. En route to Jerusalem, we stop at an overlook of the Old Jericho Road, the setting of Jesus' Parable of the Good Samaritan. Lunch will be in Bethlehem, followed by visits to the Church of the Nativity and Shepherds' Fields. Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem (B)(D)

Tues, March 2

Jerusalem

This morning we wake up in Jerusalem and begin on the Mt. of Olives for a panoramic view of the city before walking the Palm Sunday Road to the Garden of Gethsemane. Passing through Lion's Gate, we visit the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the crippled man. We then walk the Via Dolorosa, remembering Christ's suffering as we make our way to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, where Jesus was crucified, buried, and rose again. After lunch, we visit the Israel Museum to see the model of Jerusalem from the time of Jesus and tour the Shrine of the Book, home of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem (B)(D)

Wed, March 3

Jerusalem

After breakfast, we visit the Temple Mount, built atop Mt. Moriah, where Abraham was commanded to sacrifice Isaac and where the First and Second Temples once stood. We stop at the Western Wall for a time of prayer before continuing to the City of David excavations, where we will see the remains of David's palace. We then walk underground alongside Hezekiah's Tunnel and conclude with a visit to the Pool of Siloam, where Jesus healed the man born blind. Next we'll walk up the newly opened Pilgrim's Tunnel. There will be a time of worship and reflection while sitting on the original Southern Steps to the temple. Lunch will be in the Jewish Quarter, followed by a walk along the ancient Roman street known as the Cardo. After lunch enjoy free time for shopping. Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem (B)(D)

Thurs, March 4

Jerusalem

This morning begins in the Valley of Elah, where David slew Goliath. Afterwards, we visit Mt. Zion and worship in the Upper Room, where the Last Supper took place. We then visit the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu, where Jesus was held before His trial. We conclude our unforgettable journey through the Holy Land with a communion service at the Garden Tomb. Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem (B)(D)

Fri, March 5

Depart Tel Aviv and arrive in the USA.
